Return & Earn Recycling



Many of you may not know that Kerrie Lawler, one of our sewing ladies, and a few of her non-ICC friends save their

bottles and cans so that Kerrie can cash them in to purchase items for our Christmas hampers and gift baskets each year. This allows Kerrie to pick up bargain buys when items are on half price specials, which ensures those vouchers go even further. We are therefore wondering if you would like to save your cans and bottles and bring them into the showground any Friday for Kerrie, who will then put them through the Return & Earn machine. If this is not possible, then we may be able to come to some other arrangement to collect them from you.

Alternatively, we are now also registered on the Return and Earn app as an eligible charity, so anyone in NSW can select our group and support our cause.

Membership Fees

We have held our membership fees at \$25 for 3 years for quite some time now, however, due to increases in costs, the Committee has agreed on a small increase. As of 1 July 2025, renewal fees will be due and these will increase to \$30, which will take you through until 30 June 2028. As from 1 May 2025 you can renew your membership by paying your fees via PayPal, direct deposit to our General Account, at the sewing group each Friday morning, to Leslie Adie at the Cancer Centre or Jeanette Emmerich at the Lymphoedema Clinic or by placing your monies in an envelope in the driver's payment box on the ground floor in the foyer at the hospital. Please remember to include your name in the reference details should you make a direct deposit, or if leaving cash in the driver's box. If a receipt is required, then please also mention this at the time of payment, which can then be emailed to you, if one is not available at that time.
