We take this opportunity to sing the praises of your wonderful drivers – so reliable, always on time, a phone call the day before to confirm our pickup and every one of them the nicest people you could wish to meet.

At the end of Don's treatment, we were relieved to get back to our lives and a normal routine but had to admit to a feeling of sadness because we had to say goodbye to our daily friendly conversations with your drivers.

In our opinion, to have this service and these caring people at such a difficult time is precious. We hope the importance of this service and the volunteers who make it possible is appreciated and that it will be unending and it will get the support it needs to continue.
